MONTHLY SOCIETY MEETINGS

OCTOBER – The October meeting was held on Saturday 1st October, at Collège du St Esprit, Sir Virgil Naz Avenue, Quatre Bornes at 2 p.m.

The agenda was made up of four items :

- Philatelic Terms – An Update
- More on Postal History of Mauritius
- Several Exhibition Panels
- Notice Board – The latest world wide

Philatelic Terms was a five-page updated 2005 A-Z glossary of terms used in philately. **More on Postal History** included Carrier and Delivery Marks such as a November 1926 Phoenix Delivery Mark, rainfall data on postal stationery dated 1900 and 1901 addressed to Dr Edwards at Curepipe Road and Réduit and several Qantas 1952 First Flight Covers. Several layouts and write-ups prepared for the **Colonial Period 1847-1968 Stamp Exhibition** were previewed. **The latest world wide** on the notice board featured many stamps and covers as well as QSL cards.

The October Outing was cancelled as the date clashed with the Exhibition.

Attendance was very good and sales from the Bid Board and Purchase List satisfactory.

NOVEMBER – The November Society meeting was held at Collège du St Esprit, Quatre Bornes, on Saturday 5th November at 2 p.m.

There were five items on the afternoon's agenda :

- Philatelic News and New Issues World Wide
- Mauritius UPU – World Post Day
- Stone Buildings Stamps
- Some Exhibition Panels
- Indian Ocean Islands ... by Mico Antoine and Steve Pendleton

Several French award winning stamps and the new environment friendly French stamp printed on recycled paper were shown under the first item as were some recent Russian stamps. The second and third items are dealt with elsewhere in this "News Items". Many attractive privately made illustrated covers for both the **World Post Day** event and **Stone Buildings** stamps were displayed. All the Arms, Type I and Type II, from the October Exhibition were shown and explained (due to the interest in these definitives) under the fourth item.

The 75-page monograph on **INDIAN OCEAN ISLANDS – HISTORY AND PHILATELY OF RODRIGUES, AGALEGA, ST. BRANDON, ZES AND ILES EPARSEES** by Mico Antoine and Steve Pendleton was reviewed and firm orders for the publication were taken.

Several new members, signed up during the October Exhibition, showed up. Two potential members were also invited and one signed up during the meeting.

Sales from the Bid Board and Purchase List were good. Attendance was very high.

DECEMBER – The last meeting of 2005 was held at Collège du St Esprit, Sir Virgil Naz Avenue, Quatre Bornes at 2 p.m. on Saturday 3rd December 2005.

The Management Committee at its November meeting decided that a JUMBLE SALE would be held in December where only things philatelic would be traded. The convocation made this very clear and members were instructed on how to present their lots. Conditions of the CASH ONLY sale, – payment on the spot by buyers and cash settlement on the spot to vendors, – the Society's 10% commission and other procedures were described.

The first JUMBLE SALE was a total success. Vendors, buyers and all present conducted themselves in an exemplary manner. Stamps, covers, accessories, albums, collections, books, brochures and other philatelic material were offered and the turnover was the highest for the year, as was the Society's commission. Material offered by the Society sold well and proceeds from some items were donated to the Society by a couple of members.

The attendance was the highest for the year – a good ending to 2005.

Mico Antoine set up a display as a backdrop to the day's get together on aspects of French philately, Indian Official First Day Covers and the Mauritius Chamber of Commerce and Industry Bicentenary stamps and artworks by Patrice Offman as well as some signed covers.

New member, Derek Taylor, at the time (in 2000) President of the Mauritius Chamber of Commerce and Industry, gave a short interesting talk on the background to the first triangles of Mauritius. It was he who first suggested a set of triangle stamps for the Chamber's bicentenary and when the "competent authorities" turned down the triangle stamps request, the Chamber consulted the Mauritius Philatelic Society. The two met twice and the Society can jointly claim some (not all of course) credit for the subsequent issue of the first triangles of Mauritius.

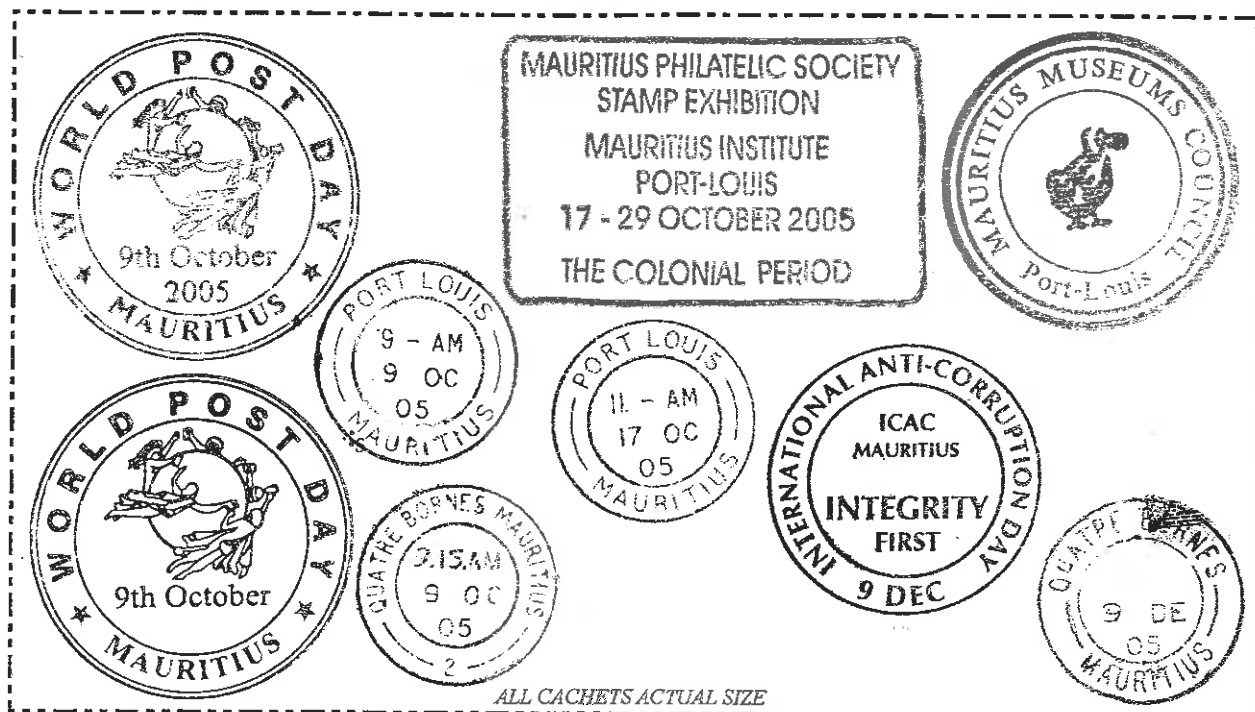

STAMPS

Stone Buildings

A set of three special stamps titled **Stone Buildings** was released on Sunday 9th October. The stamps feature :

- Rs 2 Vagrant Depot GRNW
- Rs 7 Postal Museum Port Louis
- Rs 16 Carnegie Library Curepipe

A fourth stamp (Curepipe District Court) was dropped from this set because the structure 'looked too much like Carnegie Library' which happens to be round the corner from the building on the third stamp. The set was designed by Nick Shewring and printed by BDT International Security Printing Ltd of Ireland.

The Official First Day Cover priced at Rs 50 is illustrated with the former Port Louis Main Post Office known locally as *La Poste Centrale*.

Ship Models

A set of four special stamps titled **Ship Models** was released on Saturday 24th December 2005. The stamps feature :

- Rs 7 100 Gun Ship
- Rs 8 Sampan
- Rs 9 Roman Galley
- Rs 16 Drakkar

On the untitled data card the design of the set is attributed to a graphic designer employed by the Corporate Office of the Mauritius Post Ltd. The stamps were printed by BDT International Security Printing Ltd of Ireland.

The Official First Day Cover was offered on Saturday 24th December at Rs 75 per unit and the price was increased to Rs 100 as from Monday 26th December 2005.

A souvenir sheet, not described or titled in the insert, shows a jumble of model ships on a "work desk" with a close-up of the Drakkar's "dragon's head" perforated as a stamp with the face value of Rs 25. This has got to be the ugliest souvenir sheet ever issued by Mauritius.

A set of five stampless postcards depicting the four stamps and the souvenir sheet were also produced and priced at Rs 10 per unit, Rs50 for the set.

WORLD POST DAY

The Board and Management of the Mauritius Post Ltd with the collaboration of the Post Office Benevolent Fund, the Postal Employees Cooperative Credit Union and the Common Front Trade Unions of Mauritius Post Ltd celebrated **World Post Day** at the Post Office Building (*La Poste Centrale*), Quay Street, Port Louis on Sunday 9th October 2005 from 10.00 to 12.00 hrs with Hon. Etienne Sinatambou, Minister of Information Technology and Telecommunications (responsible for postal matters) gracing the function by his presence.

This was a postal workers' get together (with a few invited guests) to witness the release of the **Stone Buildings** stamps, the official repossession of *La Poste Centrale* by the Postal Services and the return of the Philatelic Bureau which transferred back from Dumas Street.

[The Mauritius Postal Services returned home to the General Post Office Building on World Post Day 9th October 2005 after departing to Dumas Street on 29th May 2004.]

WORLD POST DAY CACHETS

New **World Post Day** cachets were used at the following offices to mark this occasion in October 2005; Beau Bassin, Curepipe, Quatre Bornes, Rose Hill, Vacoas (Counter), the Postal Museum and the Philatelic Bureau in Port Louis and also at the SSR Office of Exchange (Plaisance Airport) and the Sorting Office at Port Louis from 7th to 11th October.

The **World Post Day** cachets used at the Postal Museum and the Philatelic Bureau incorporate the full date (9th October 2005), all the other cachets do not have the full date, only the day and month (9th October) appear.

On the fifteen older **World Post Day** cachets in use prior to 2005 the Red Indian and the four letter carriers encircling the globe are found in many different positions – each new order of cachets resulted in new positioning of the carriers. On the 9th October **World Post Day** cachets used in 2005 the logo of the UPU has been reproduced as per the official emblem on **all** the new cachets.

WORLD POST DAY SERVICE

On Sunday 9th October, **World Post Day**, limited postal services, in the main the sale of stamps and the servicing of first day covers, were available from 8.15 to 9.15 hrs at the following post offices: Beau Bassin, Curepipe, Quatre Bornes, Rose Hill, Vacoas (counter) and the Postal Museum.

The new Philatelic Bureau at *La Poste Centrale* Quay Street provided a special counter service from 8.15 to 11.00 hours.

N.B. The sale of the **Stone Buildings** Official First Day Covers was exceptionally extended to all post offices in Mauritius and Rodrigues on Monday 10th October 2005 only.

INTERNATIONAL ANTI-CORRUPTION DAY

To mark the United Nations decreed **International Anti-Corruption Day** on 9th December 2005, the Mauritian Independent Commission Against Corruption ICAC (which has been in the news since its conception for all the wrong reasons) with the collaboration of Mauritius Post Ltd “**impressed** with a rubber stamp and red ink” (sic) on as many ordinary items of correspondence, both local and foreign posted during the period 5th to 9th December 2005.

The double circle circular cachets measures just over 3.5 cm and has the words “International Anti-Corruption Day 9 Dec” within the circles and in the centre the message “**ICAC/Mauritius/Integrity/First**” in four lines.

Twenty five rubber stamps were issued to 19 offices as follows, GPO Sorting (5), SSR OE (3), and one each at Quatre Bornes, Rose Hill, Beau Bassin, Vacoas, Phoenix, Triolet, Central Flacq, Mahebourg, Chemin Grenier, Petite Rivière, Saint Pierre, Rivière du Rempart, Goodlands, Reduit, Floreal, Eau Coulée, Forest Side.

A memorandum dated 30th November 2005 contained instructions that the “the rubber stamps, inking pad and ink (if any)” be returned to headquarters under registered cover on the 10th December 2005.

Ed. Note. The cachet has been seen on covers struck in red from Floreal, Petite Rivière, GPO Sorting, Eau Coulée, Reduit and struck in blue from Quatre Bornes and an Eau Coulée cover struck twice – in red on departure from Eau Coulée and in blue on arrival at Quatre Bornes.

SPECIAL COVERS

“Bicentenary Commemoration of Al Aqsa Mosque”

A special commemorative cover was released by the Association for the Al Aqsa Bicentenary Commemoration to mark the 200 years of the founding of the mosque in 1805. The cover is illustrated with a view of Al Aqsa Mosque similar in design to that of the R1 value of the 250th Anniversary of Port Louis stamp issued in 1985 (SG 717). Three stamps of the “Trochetia” commemorative set (Re1, Rs4 and Rs7 of June 2003) are affixed to the cover and the cover bears two strikes of the Port Louis E.S. (slug) double circle circular datestamp of 5th October 2005. An insert provides useful data in English and French. 1300 covers were produced and the price of a unit Rs25.00.

The Colonial Period 1847 – 1968

A special commemorative cover was released at 11 a.m. on 17th October 2005 by the Mauritius Philatelic Society to mark the first day of the Exhibition held at the Mauritius Institute in Port Louis from 17th to 29th October 2005. The cover is franked with the full set of the Stone Buildings stamps and bears two strikes of a Port Louis double circle circular datestamp from the Philatelic Bureau. The cover is illustrated with the logo of the Society and the two types of the Arms stamps of the Colonial Period. Two special cachets were applied to the cover, the Society’s rectangular cachet made especially for the Exhibition and applied only to the 125 numbered covers (1 – 125) reading in six lines /Mauritius Philatelic Society/Stamp Exhibition/Mauritius Institute/Port Louis/17 – 29 October 2005/The Colonial Period/ and the circular Mauritius Museums Council Port Louis cachet. The covers were offered at Rs100.00 per unit and the proceeds used to defray the costs of staging the Exhibition.

STAMP EXHIBITION – 2005

The Society held a stamp exhibition at the Mauritius Institute, La Chaussée, Port Louis from Monday 17th October to Saturday 29th October 2005 under the aegis of and with the participation of the Mauritius Museums Council.

The exhibition was opened to the public from 9.00 to 16.00 hrs daily Monday to Friday and 9.00 to 12.00 hrs on Saturdays.

The exhibition titled, **The Colonial Period 1847 – 1968** featured the Classics, the Queen’s Head, the Arms, the King’s Heads, Elizabethan Stamps, Aerophilately, World War II Censorship, the Railways and B53 on 27 wall-mounted panels. Stamps, covers and other exhibits were in the main provided by Mico Antoine and Patrick Kwan Cheung. Dr A. N. Maderbokus, Vicky Cushmajee and Randhir Mungra also provided several Post Pairs, Britannias and a few other stamps from their collections. The Mauritius Museums Council participated in the exhibition by putting on show, for the very first time in two display units, stamps and covers from Dr Vaughan’s collection. Reginald Edward Vaughan was a former director of the Mauritius Institute who donated his collection, housed in three albums, to the Institute.

The Society got good press and television coverage and many visitors, locals and tourists, visited the exhibition during the two-week period. A small sales counter offered Mauritian stamps and covers.

AN ANNUAL MAGAZINE

A new editorial team of the Mauritius Post Ltd released one new look magazine in December 2005. The former *Edition trimestrielle* of December 2004, only two of which were actually produced during the whole of 2004, has in 2005 become a single annual in-house magazine. Still carrying the title "*Blue Penny News*" the *Edition Decembre 2005* is a very colourful 16-page bulletin with plenty of pictures and very little of substance. The text is 90% French and 10% English. The two pages devoted to *Philatélie* have English titles for some stamps, French for others (when the actual stamps have English, scientific or Latin titles) and a First Day Cover becomes le *First Day Cover* in French, a 100 Gun Ship stamp of the Ship Models set becomes *Soleil Royal* in French then there are the in-house fabricated Stamp Booklets that are described as Stamp Packs.

Details of the Stamp Booklets will appear in the first "News Items" of 2006.

TELECOM SMART CARDS

Chamarel Waterfalls (IV)

A new Smart Card featuring the Chamarel Waterfalls and exact in design on recto as the last Waterfalls (III) was put on sale in the first half of 2005. On verso the shaded blue area of the card has been redesigned; the blue is deeper and the area has been reduced to allow for the inclusion of the barcode number 6 091300 221077. The text is the same as that of all the previous Chamarel Waterfalls cards. The price of the 55 units card is Rs50 exclusive of VAT.

Chamarel Coloured Earth (IV)

A new Smart Card featuring Chamarel Coloured Earth (which just in case you did not know is a stone's throw from Chamarel Waterfalls) and exact in design on recto as the last Chamarel Coloured Earth (III) was put on sale in the second half of 2005. On verso the shaded reddish-brown area of the card has been redesigned; the colour is of a deeper hue and the area reduced to allow for the inclusion of the barcode. The number of this card is 6 091300 221084. The text is the same as that of all the previous Chamarel Coloured Earth cards. The price of the 115 units card is Rs100 exclusive of VAT.

Pamplemousses Gardens (IV)

A new Smart Card featuring Pamplemousses Gardens exact in design on recto as the last (III) card was put on sale in the last quarter of 2005. On verso the shaded area has been redesigned. The coloured area is reduced and is of a darker olive hue, the text has been shortened with three lines removed and the barcode number is 6 091300 221060. The price of the 240 units card is Rs200 exclusive of VAT.

N.B. THE SOCIETY WILL NO LONGER LIST TELECOM SMART CARDS AS FROM JANUARY 2006.
