MONTHLY SOCIETY MEETINGS

JULY - The July meeting was held, exceptionally, on the second Saturday of the month 10th July at 2 p.m. at College St Esprit, Sir Virgil Naz Avenue. The programme for the afternoon included a review of the 10th Anniversary Stamp Exhibition, a display of photographs of the inauguration of the exhibition and specially for our new members a talk on "Some dos and don'ts about stamp collecting".

Members also showed their own "Mauritius Through Artists' Eyes" covers, their exhibition covers and their photographs of our Expo. News Items 99.2 of June 1999 was distributed and all new members received back issues of the Society's Newsletters.

AUGUST - The meeting was held on Saturday 7th August at 2 p.m. at the usual venue. For the benefit of new members an "Introduction to Postal History" and "Thematics - How and where to start" were the subjects discussed at the meeting. A comprehensive five boards display of relevant covers, stamps and other material was put up.

SEPTEMBER - In September the meeting was held on Saturday 4th at 2 p.m. at College St Esprit. Two topics were shown and explained :-

- (a) Fiscals - Bills of Exchange, Internal Revenue and Insurance Stamps - by Sanjit Teelock.
- (b) B53 Obliterators - by Patrick Kwan.

During the third quarter of this year attendance has been very good with the September attendance being the highest for the last two years.

Sales of covers and stamps have also been good with a range of quality items offered on the Bid Board and in the Purchase List.

The October meeting will be a "Share what you know - Learn what you don't" get together.

In November the Society expects to have a guest lecturer to give a talk on Chimneys, accompanied by a video recording.

The year end recess means there will be no Society meetings in December 1999 and January 2000. The Committee has decided to repeat the December 1998 lunch experience at the same venue and under the same conditions. SADC DAY

A special rubber stamp to commemorate the Southern African Development Community (SADC) Day - 17 AUGUST 1999 - was used "for impressing on as many items of correspondence as possible posted and received at your post office during the period 12th August to 20th August 1999, particularly on 17th August 1999". The rubber stamps had to be returned to Headquarters by 25th August. (Circular letter PS/P/200 of 6th August 1999).

The boxed rectangular three lines mark measuring 25 x 58mm incorporates a SADC logo and the words MAURITIUS SADC DAY 17 AUGUST which are 3mm high. In Rodrigues only Port Mathurin post office was supplied with a SADC rubber stamp.

OLD CHIMNEYS

On 17th September a commemorative set of stamps featuring four chimneys was released.

- Re 1 Old Chimneys - *Alma*
- Rs 2 Old Chimneys - *Antoinette*
- Rs 5 Old Chimneys - *Belle Mare*
- Rs 7 Old Chimneys - *Grande Rosalie*

A souvenir sheet of the four stamps with Mon Désert Alma Sugar Factory shown in the background is titled **Old Sugar Mills Chimneys**.

Two official First Day Covers, each priced at Rs 25, are (both) illustrated with a chimney at Beau Séjour.

Stamps and souvenir sheet designed by Nick Shewring; printed by The House of Questa.

The UK printed colour poster has the set titled **Old Chimneys**; the same title as on the stamps and in the official programme. The locally printed Government Printers (green) poster describes the stamps as **Old Sugar Mills Chimneys** the same description as on the souvenir sheet. The Postal Services press release of 3rd September 1999 announced the issue as **Old Sugar Mills Chimneys**.

The official 1999 stamp programme describes the Old Chimneys set of stamps as - Mount, Belle Mare, Antoinette and Alma.

NEXT COMMEMORATIVE ISSUE

ACHIEVEMENTS IN THE 20th CENTURY

The next commemorative set of stamps is scheduled for December 1999. The official programme describe these as:

- Emancipation of Women (Judge and Pilot)
- Special Sugars
- Sprayer with inset mosquito
- Centre de Conference Grand Baie with flags

LIGHTHOUSES AEROGRAMMES

A new pictorial aerogramme illustrated with three lighthouses (SG 926 Ile Plate, SG 927 Pointe aux Caves, SG 928 Ile aux Fouquets) from the Lighthouses set of commemorative stamps of 1995 was put on sale on 16th June 1999.

In November 1998 the contract for the production of 1,000,000 units of these aerogrammes was awarded to ENSCHEDE of the Netherlands. 360,000 units had been delivered at mid August 1999, the balance to be dispatched on an agreed schedule.

PRESS NOTICES

TEMPORARY CLOSURE - PORT LOUIS STATION POST OFFICE

As a result of an attempted burglary at Port Louis Station Post Office, Victoria Square, the public was advised by a press notice of 9th August that the post office "will be temporarily closed until further notice". The break-in occurred during the night of 5th August and the post office was closed as from 6th August.

Another press notice of 23rd August 1999 informed the public that Port Louis Station Post Office, Victoria Square, resumed its operations as from 21st August 1999.

FOREST SIDE POST OFFICE

A press notice of 25th August 1999 informed the public that Forest Side Post Office "will resume operations as soon as the repairs to the building are completed."

"In the meantime correspondence bearing the appropriate postage may be posted in the letter box of that office."

WEST AFRICAN FRAUD/419 LETTER SCAMS/NIGERIAN LETTERS

A police communiqué bearing the above title warned the Mauritian public about the "*advance fee fraud... operated by Nigerian fraudsters*".

The Society dealt with this subject in November 1998. See News Items 98.4 of December 1998. These scam letters continue to arrive. One addressed to a member's home address is "meter marked" **LOME RP 9 8 99 - République Togolaise** with a poor fraudulent purple rubber stamp strike. Earlier scam letters seen had fake Nigerian stamps with fake obliterations from Nigerian towns.

BANKNOTES

The redesigned Rs 1000. Sir Gaëtan Duval banknote was put in circulation on 24th August 1999 thus completing the new series of new banknotes that went in circulation on 1st July 1999. The new Rs 1000 banknote shows a smiling Sir Gaëtan Duval (replacing the scowling portrait on the former banknote of 30th October 1998) recto, and verso has State House (*Le Reduit*) replacing female sega dancers.

Other major modifications on all the new banknotes are :

- (a) the re-establishment of the order of Tamil and Hindi inscriptions,
- (b) the signatures of the new Governor and the new Managing Director of the Bank of Mauritius namely Messrs Basant Roi and B R Gujadhur replacing those of the former post holders Messrs Dan Maraye and B Gujadhur, and
- (c) the complete colour change of the Rs 100 banknote from green to pink.

Other modifications and security improvements have also been made.

A press notice of the Bank of Mauritius dated 3rd August 1999 states that -
“ Banknotes issued by the Bank prior to 1st July 1999 will cease to be legal tender as from 1st October 1999”.

On Thursday 30th September Mauritius Broadcasting Corporation television and radio announced the postponement of the “cease to be legal tender” deadline.

THE MINISTRY OF TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

According to a report in *L'express* of Sunday 26th September, the Government reshuffle of Saturday 25th September detaches the Postal Services from the Ministry of Public Utilities and appends it to the Ministry of Telecommunications and Information Technology.
