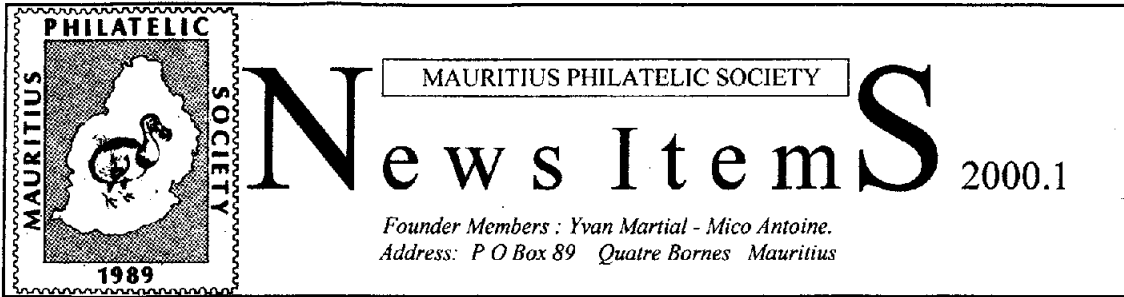

The Mauritius Chamber of Commerce and Industry 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary commemorative stamps was the main topic. The first triangle stamps ever issued by Mauritius, the background story to its release, the advisory role of the Society (to the MCCI) and a collection of triangle stamps from South Africa, USA, Monaco, Kenya, Republik Maluku Selatan, Poland, Ecuador, Gabon, Hungary, Congo, “Free Croatia” and Patrice Offman’s original and final artwork (courtesy of MCCI) were shown and explained.

France and UK 1999 issues and some millennium material were also shown.

MARCH – The Annual General Meeting was held on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> March 2000 at 2.00 p.m. in the school hall of College du St Esprit. The first Saturday of the month, 4<sup>th</sup> March was a public holiday – Maha Shivaratree.

**STAMPS**

**150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Mauritius Chamber of Commerce and Industry**

On 25<sup>th</sup> January 2000 a commemorative set of stamps was released on the occasion of the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Mauritius Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

The first set of stamps of the new millennium are triangular in design and are the first triangular stamps issued in Mauritius.

- Re 1 Coat of Arms of the Mauritius Chamber of Commerce and Industry
- Rs 2 Unity Vision Service - Vision of Mauritius Chamber of Commerce and Industry
- Rs 7 Francis Channell First Secretary 1850-1872 of Mauritius Chamber of Commerce and Industry
- Rs 15 Louis Léchelle First President 1850 of Mauritius Chamber of Commerce and Industry

The Official First Day Cover priced at Rs 30 displays a picture of the façade of the Chamber's seat at 3, Royal Street, Port Louis.

The stamps were designed by Mauritian graphic artist Patrice Offman, whose name is misspelt by the Postal Services on their bright orange poster as Patrice Hoffman. The stamps were printed by Joh Enschede of Holland, and were produced se-tenant in sheets of 60 stamps with some interesting perforations and selvages on several stamps in the two panes.

The Mauritius Chamber of Commerce and Industry 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary commemorative stamps were printed in very limited quantities; the lowest printing for any recent commemoratives.

The quantities (made available to us) are as follows:

Re 1	510,000	Rs 2	35,220
Rs 7	35,220	Rs 15	35,220

At mid-March three values (Rs 2, Rs 7, Rs 15) were almost sold out.

**BEETLES**

On 29<sup>th</sup> March, a special set of stamps featuring the following was released.

- Re 1 *Cratopus striga*
- Rs 2 *Cratopus armatus*
- Rs 3 *Cratopus chrysochlorus*
- Rs 10 *Cratopus nigrogranatus*

On the stamps only the scientific names of the species are mentioned. However on the two posters announcing the stamps the title of the set is **INSECTS (BEETLES)**. The two Official First Day Covers are illustrated with *Cratopus flavomaculatus* and beneath the illustration is the set title **INSECTS (BEETLES)**.

Note that *Cratopus armatus* was not announced in the official programme and that *Cratopus flavomaculatus* which illustrates the cover was announced as the fourth stamp.

A miniature sheet incorporating the four stamps has a foliage border.

Two Official First Day Covers, one with the stamps and the other with the miniature sheet are priced at Rs 30 each.

The stamps were designed by Ross Watton and printed by The House of Questa.

A set of four stamps will be issued in June on the occasion of the Olympics Games to be held in Sydney, Australia. The official Postal Services programme describes the designs as :

- Judo
- Archery
- Handball?
- Sailing

With a ? after Handball.... and in June we will find out what discipline Sailing is!

The grapevine has it that the **Personalities** set scheduled for September is to be split into two. One set of four stamps will be devoted exclusively to the "Father of the Nation" Sir Seewoosagur Ramgoolam, whose birth centenary falls this year. This event merits a full set (by Mauritian standards) and should have been foreseen by the competent authorities.

Another set is to be issued for the remaining three personalities, selected for ethnic balance as none of them are in the same league as S.S.R., Dr Idrice Goomany – Moslem social worker, Alphonse Ravaton – Creole *segatier*, A Tank Wen – Chinese trader. As the last two are from the General Population other ethnic groups may be justified in being felt left out, even if a fourth personality is brought in to establish some balance ...four stamps each set.

The grapevine also has it that the long overdue **FISH** definitive stamps, prepared as far back as and initially planned for release in 1996, will be released in October 2000.

Time will tell whether or not the rumours or local *palabres* are true.
